Edge coaching increases students' ability to:

- Make good decisions
- Learn skills needed to succeed in school the ability to plan, prioritize, initiate, stay on task, focus, follow up and adjust to change
- Realize their many abilities and channel them to achieve
- Work hard and remember the details needed to finish a project
- Control impulsiveness and learn how to fit in
- Gain the right executive function tools to do their best
- Keep their eye on the prize and understand that a diploma is critical to breaking the poverty cycle
- Be motivated to come to school every day, earn their diploma and have a plan for college and/or job training

Many of the students have faced Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs), which include abuse, neglect, family/household challenges and other traumas. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) estimates that 5.2 million school-aged children, or about 10 percent, in the United States have formal diagnoses of Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD), one of the best-known barriers to social and emotional learning. The National Health Interview suggests that these numbers do not include those who are undiagnosed.

The Edge Foundation helps students succeed at school by training school personnel – teachers, paraprofessionals, security personnel, counselors and administrators - to provide one-on-one, weekly, 15- to 20-minute coaching to individual students.

"Edge coaches help students succeed by helping them develop agency – the ability to successfully act on their own behalf to solve problems and make good decisions in school and in life," Peterson said.

A study by Wayne State University looked at Edge Foundation coaching methods involving students from 10 universities and community colleges. The study was the largest and most comprehensive study of ADHD coaching conducted to date. The research team determined that the Edge Coaching model was four times more effective than any other educational intervention in helping students improve executive functioning and related skills as measured by the Learning and Study Strategies Inventory (LASSI; Weinstein and Palmer, 2002).

Schools and individual teachers are required to produce results, close performance gaps, boost achievement and reduce dropout rates. Edge coaching can help them achieve success with all students. Edge Foundation coaches currently work in more than 90 schools and organizations in Washington State, Oregon, California, Pennsylvania, Mississippi and New York.
